Quick Picks: Dog-Friendly Fun



In The Bay Area

San Francisco 🍒

- **Fort Funston:** A classic! Dogs can roam off-leash on the beach and trails. Be mindful of the cliffs! *Call me if your dog's recall needs improving*.
- Golden Gate Park: Explore vast green spaces, including the designated off-leash areas.
- Crissy Field: Enjoy stunning views of the Golden Gate Bridge while your dog plays in the sand.

Marin County

- Marin Headlands (Rodeo Beach & trails): Stunning views and ocean breezes; dogs welcome on-leash in most areas.
- **Downtown Sausalito waterfront strolls:** Scenic, dog-welcoming sidewalks with nearby cafés that offer water bowls and pup-friendly patios.
- Mount Tamalpais East Peak trails: Sweeping views and shady hikes (leashed), great for confident trail dogs.

The Peninsula 🌠

- Pulgas Ridge Open Space Preserve (San Carlos): A hidden gem with an off-leash area in the center of the loop trail. Quiet, scenic, and a great place to practice recall and trail etiquette.
- **Bedwell Bayfront Park (Menlo Park):** Gorgeous bay views, wide paths, and flat terrain, perfect for older dogs or leash training in real-world settings.
- **Dog-Friendly Downtowns (Palo Alto & Burlingame):** Plenty of café patios and water bowls. Try Twelvemonth Restaurant's gorgeous dog-friendly patio in Burlingame, and seriously delicious
- food and treats for humans.



- Almaden Quicksilver County Park (San Jose): Leash-required, but wide trails and rolling hills offer great physical and mental exercise. Early mornings are peaceful and not too hot!
- Los Gatos Creek Trail: Miles of mixed-use trails ideal for jogs or strolls. Multiple dog water fountains and shade spots, plus downtown Los Gatos is super dog-friendly!
- **Ulistac Natural Area (Santa Clara):** A lesser-known spot with wildflowers, butterfly gardens, and rustic trails. Great for dogs who need a quieter, lower-stimulation environment.
- Cooper-Garrod Estate Vineyards (Saratoga): Did someone say wine tasting with your dog? Yes! This rustic, dog-welcoming winery offers trails and picnic spots. Ideal for relaxed outings with well-socialized pups.

East Bay

- Point Isabel Regional Shoreline: A huge off-leash dog park with stunning views of the Bay.
